This understanding comes from a personal lived experience spanning decades, and through other individuals I met during the 6+ years of supporting and caring for the homeless and vulnerable community of Lincolnshire. Jackie says: “I look forward to working closer with EDAN Lincs in the months and years ahead, to help and support those currently trapped and who desperately want to break free. To raise awareness of how much better life can be and support the victims of abuse to look for a brighter more caring, loving future. We all need to raise awareness to stop domestic abuse!”

Kindness of Strangers



On average every 4th woman and every 6th man experience domestic abuse in their lives. To celebrate International Women's Day we have published a story of one woman who was a victim of domestic abuse for a number of years before she managed to escape and rebuild her life. She stayed in one of our refuges. Although this lady suffered domestic abuse, she is safe now. she has managed to escape and start a new life after enduring years of domestic abuse.

She describes often being beaten until she was black and blue all over, but it wasn't just violence, she was isolated from friends and family, controlled, manipulated, enduring psychological humiliation and had her finances restricted.

She said: "No one should feel they are alone, not anytime but especially when you are enduring domestic abuse. People may think it will just go away and just stop, but once domestic abuse is happening, statistics show it will continue and often worsen. So those who are suffering from domestic abuse, you need to seek help. You need support at time like this."
