S.A.F.E e-learning course



User Guide

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Welcome

Welcome to the S.A.F.E e-learning course. S.A.F.E stands for Safety, Awareness, Freedom and Empowerment. The S.A.F.E course has been specifically designed for adults who have experienced domestic abuse. The aim of the course is to support survivors to gain more knowledge and understanding of domestic abuse.

On average, the course takes around **2.5 hours** to complete, but this may vary and be shorter or longer depending on the user's individual pace and needs. We encourage you to go at your own pace when completing the e-learning course. You do not have to complete the course in one go, you can do it in as many bite sized chunks as you want. When you sign out, it will automatically save your progress (where you got to) and when you log back in you can pick up where you left off.

You will have 2 weeks to access and complete the course from the date your EDAN worker sent you this user guide (more details are outlined in the working together agreement below).

There are **two versions** of the S.A.F.E course that you can choose from. The two versions are identical, except one version has an extra module that focuses on how domestic abuse impacts on children. **If you have children, we recommend that you access this version!** However, even if you don't have children you can still access this version should you wish.

The two versions are titled:

- S.A.F.E
- S.A.F.E (Including learning on how domestic abuse impacts on children)

The S.A.F.E course content includes:

- The different types of abuse
- Some of the common patterns of domestic abuse
- Myths and truths about domestic abuse
- Healthy relationships and core values
- Brief overview of the Impact domestic abuse has on children.
- Potential warning signs of abuse
- Dealing with grief and loss
- Moving on process ... and much more!

Safety

Our primary focus is your safety. Please ensure that it is completely safe and appropriate for you to engage with this e-learning course, and that you are not putting yourself or others at risk by engaging with it.

You should have already discussed this matter along with any necessary safety planning with your EDAN worker, but circumstances can change. Therefore, if you have any worries or concerns or no longer want to complete this course and/or feel it's no longer appropriate, please contact your EDAN Lincs Worker to discuss.

Please note: On each section of the course, we have a <u>button that functions as an escape</u> <u>button</u>. We have included this as an extra safety and security measure. By clicking on this button it will redirect you to **BBC News website**, this could be a helpful function if someone comes into the area where you are doing the course and you don't want them to see that you are visiting a domestic abuse site/course. If other people have access to the device you are using and this is a concern then we suggest deleting your browsing history after use.

Health warning

Due to the nature of domestic abuse, there is some sensitive topics and content within this elearning course. You may find some of the content distressing, it may remind you of your own personal experiences and trigger certain feelings and emotions around this.

Our advice is to take a break from the course if you find yourself getting upset and/or overwhelmed, and only return to it if / when you feel able to continue.

This is a voluntary course and you are under no obligation to complete it. We encourage you to reach out to a trusted person, a mental health practitioner or even your EDAN worker if the emotional distress you feel does not pass and you require support. We have included below a list of useful support services.

Due to the sensitive nature of the S.A.F.E e-learning course, we ask that you complete this course in private, away from anyone else, especially children, young people or vulnerable adults as it could be harmful to their emotional wellbeing.

We strongly advise that you do not complete this course if you are under the influence of alcohol or other illegal substances or if you are currently experiencing emotional distress.

Timescales

You have two weeks to complete the S.A.F.E course. If you do not complete the course within the agreed timescale, we will presume that you no longer require the course.

On completion of the course you will have the option of a follow up call from your EDAN worker to discuss your progress and next steps, and this should have already been discussed /arranged with you.

By going ahead with the S.A.F.E course you are agreeing to the following terms and conditions:

- ✤ I am over 16 years of age and consent to accessing the S.A.F.E e-learning course.
- It is safe and appropriate to access this e-learning package. If this changes, I confirm that I will contact my EDAN worker as soon as it is safe for me to do so.
- I will complete the S.A.F.E e-learning course within 2 weeks
- I will completely close down the S.A.F.E e-learning course after use.
- I confirm that i will not give any other person/s access to the S.A.F.E e-learning course.

Please only continue if you are in agreement with the above terms and conditions. If you have any questions or queries, please contact your EDAN worker.

Registering and Accessing the S.A.F.E. e-Learning Course

THE SAFE course is accessible through the **Safeguarding LincoInshire ENABLE training portal hosted by virtual college.**

The remaining sections of this user guide explain the two steps required to access the S.A.F.E course. Each step is broken down into easy-to-follow instructions:

Step 1) Registering for a new learner record

Step 2) Requesting the S.A.F.E. e-learning course once registered and logged on to your learner record.

6. Click in the I'm Not A Robot box and then Register at the bottom of the screen to finish:



An automatic email from Virtual College will be sent with your log in details. It may take several minutes to come through and please be sure to check your spam/junk inbox.

The email from Virtual College will say 'Welcome to Safeguarding Lincolnshire'.

The email will provide step by step instructions on how to ACTIVATE your new Learner Record (you have to do this first before accessing the S.A.F.E course).

The instructions in the email will look something like this:

Step 1 - Click on the link provided

Step 2 –Input your username, which has to be your email address.

Step 3 - You will be asked to create a password, then confirm it and click to confirm the account.

You can click the Help & Support link to view a collection of user guides and video tutorials. You can also use the Help & Support link to submit a query. Alternatively, you can call Virtual College on 01943 885095.
